RESEARCH

I am currently researching the implications of migration to Georgia of a community of peasants from the State of Querétaro, Mexico. In the last decade, these peasants were forced to relocate when the construction of a major World Bank-funded hydroelectric project, a product of the North America Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), destroyed their communities in the early 1990's. I am exploring the impact of the loss of their main source of work, their land, and the subsequent loss

of their cultural identity and how this impacts their environment, their economic well-being, their health status and their cultural traditions.
